3. My best friend is a real bookworm. She goes to the library every week and always has a new book to read.
4. Being a bookworm is often associated with the Danish *hygge* philosophy of cosiness and warmth. Try and portray this idea to your students by showing them pictures of people reading by an open fire, wearing woolly socks and drinking hot chocolate for example.

Sample answer:

- 1.He / She is reading a big book
 - 2.He / She is wearing a big woolly jumper and woolly socks.
 3. He / she is sitting in an armchair by the fire.
 4. There are candles and lots of other books in the room.
 5. There is no-one else in the room, just a cat.
5. Students may put their posters up in the classroom or take photos and share them digitally if classes are in distance learning mode.
