A SLIDE PRESENTATION ON SUSTAINABLE GOALS

This Project will allow you to

- exploit and improve your language and communication skills
- find, select, interpret and use new information and knowledge
- practise and assess your team working skills
- learn, or improve, technological skills

You are going to prepare a slide presentation about the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), an agenda adopted by all United Nations Member States in 2015 when world leaders agreed on 17 goals for a better world by 2030. These goals are intended to put an end to poverty, to fight inequality and to stop climate change. Guided by the goals, it is now up to all of us to work together to build a better future for everyone. What can you do to make the world a better place to live in?



STEP 1 Find out more about the SDGs

- In your opinion, what are the most serious problems we are facing as a community? As a country? All over the world? Make a list of 4/6 ideas and share it with your partner.
- This is the list of the seventeen Goals for Sustainable Development: how can the problems you have identified be matched with the SDGs?
- In your opinion, who is responsible for achieving the Global Goals? Do young people have a responsibility to achieve the Global Goals? Do you think you can do something?

STEP 2 Define your objectives

Divide into groups. Each group decides which Global Goal they want to learn more about.

STEP 3 Select the information

STEP 4 With the information you have collected prepare a slide presentation about your Global Goal following the example on the right.

HOW TO MAKE SLIDES EFFECTIVELY

A slide is a powerful tool for giving a presentation. It helps you organise information and ideas, it supports your speech with images and essential data, and it improves the audience's attention.

Stage 1 - the overall context

Begin creating your presentation by determining the overall objectives:

- What is the purpose of the presentation?
- Do you want to inform people about your Global Goal?
- Convince people to take action.
- Other?

Stage 2 - the content

Plan your content on paper. Don't start with the software. Make an outline of your presentation.

WHAT?

- What are the main points you want to make?
- Which points are the most important?

SAMPLE

Here are few slides about a project on Goal #5: 'Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls'. They are just a sample of what you may include in some of your slides.

Global Goal #5 is about gender equality

WHY is GLOBAL GOAL #5 important?

It's an important goal because it is shocking to realise that women around the world still have to fight every day, both at home and at work, to overcome gender inequality.



If we continue to deny women equal rights, we deny half the population a chance to live life at its fullest. Political, economic and social equality for women will benefit all the world's citizens. It is important to eradicate prejudice and work for equal rights and respect for all.

WHAT IS GENDER EQUALITY ABOUT?

TARGETS



End all violence against and exploitation of women and girls.



Ensure full participation in leadership and decision-making.



End discrimination against women and girls.

Gender equality is achieved when women and men enjoy the same rights and opportunities across all sectors of society, including economic participation and decision-making.

Gender equality does not mean that women and men have to become the same, but that their rights, responsibilities and opportunities will not depend on whether they were born male or female.

Facts and figures

77 cents

Globally, women earn only 77 cents for every dollar that men earn doing the same work.

7 in 10

Up to 7 in 10 women around the world experience physical and/or sexual violence at some point in their lifetime.

20%

Less than 20 percent of the world's landholders are women.

750 million

Worldwide, almost 750 million women and girls alive today were married before their 18th birthday.

2 of 3

Two thirds of countries in the developing world have achieved gender parity in primary education.

22.8%

Only 22.8 percent of all national parliamentarians were women as of June 2016, up from 11.3 percent in 1995.

This slide gives us an idea of where most inequalities still exist. For example, in many cases men and women don't earn the same even if they do the same job.

HOW?

- What order should they be presented in? You can choose between
 - problem / pathway / solution
 - problem / solution / reasoning

Stage 3 - the slides

- One point = One slide. If necessary, split the content of one slide into two slides. Have little text and few bullet points on your slides
- Use very few fonts and large font size
- Use visual aids to enhance audience understanding: photos, not clipart

Stage 4 - rehearsal

- Do not read your slides
- Look at every slide and ask yourself, will the audience understand it/remember it?
