25 MP3 From Primary School to University

In Great Britain education is compulsory¹ from the age of 5 to 15 years old. **State schools** are free and parents do not pay for books. They only buy pens and pencils. 93% of children in England and Wales go to state schools.

Primary school starts with Year 1 and finishes with Year 6. At the age of 11 children go to **Secondary school** (Year 7 to 11). Very clever children take an exam in Year 6 (**Eleven plus**) and go to a Grammar school. At Secondary schools children study English, Maths, Science, Information Technology (IT), History, Geography, Music, Art, Physical Education (PE), Religious Education (RE) and a modern foreign language like French or German. They take **SAT** tests (Standard Assessment Task) in all subjects at the ages of 7, 11 and 14. At the age of 16 they take **GCSEs** (General Certificate of Secondary Education).

Each student has a candidate number and an external Exam Board² corrects the exams.

Years 12 and 13 are not compulsory. Students who go into Years 12 and 13 can take **A-levels** (Advanced level exams). Pupils³ need good GCSE and A-levels results to go to University.

The Government is making school exams more difficult in England.

Public Schools

There are about two hundred public schools in Britain. They are private independent schools and parents pay fees⁴. Public schools are very expensive, but some give scholarships⁵. These schools have wonderful facilities⁶ and some famous public schools are Eton, Rugby and Westminster.



Uniforms

In Britain schoolchildren wear a uniform! In winter boys wear long grey, blue or black trousers⁷ with a white shirt⁸ and tie⁹. They have a jumper¹⁰ and a jacket with the school logo on. They don't wear trainers¹¹ to school. They wear black school shoes. The girls wear the same and they can choose to wear a grey, blue or black skirt¹². In summer the boys wear shorts and the girls wear summer dresses.

Teachers

At Primary school children call teachers by their surname: Mr/Ms Smith.

In Secondary school they call teachers Miss or Sir.

At University students call their teachers by their name.

A Typical School Day

- 8.30 Registration: a teacher calls the names and students listen to announcements.
- 9.00 First Period: the lessons are in different rooms and places around the school. Each room has a name or number.
- 10.00 Second Period
- 11.00 Break: time for a snack and a chat.
- 11.20 Third Period
- 12.30 Fourth Period
- 1.30 Lunch
- 2.10 Fifth Period
- 3.10 School ends

After school there are clubs and activities – a theatre club, a school orchestra and a choir. There is a lot of sport at school.

Every student carries a swipe card. They swipe into every lesson. Students can put money on their swipe card¹³ and buy food and drinks.

Students use tablet computers in a lot of lessons.



Different Schools

There are different kinds of schools in Great Britain today. **Academies** are independent state schools. The head teachers of Academies can choose the subjects they want to teach. **Free schools** are schools set up by parents, teachers, community, faith groups¹⁴ and so on.
